## CHAPTER 197 PETITION FOR RULE MAKING

**261—197.1(17A) Incorporation by reference.** The authority incorporates by this reference all such matters in Iowa Code chapter 17A that relate to petitions for rulemaking.

The authority may schedule a meeting between the petitioner and the authority. The final decision on whether the circumstances justify the granting of a petition is in the sole discretion of the authority. A decision will be issued in accordance with Iowa Code section 17A.7, subsection 1.
